Why do we light candles during worship?

The practice of lighting candles is an important tradition in Reformed churches. The need for light is

fundamental. There can be no life without light, so it will come as no surprise, then, to learn that images of light and darkness recur throughout the Bible.

Since ancient times, light and fire have reminded people that God is here with us.

Bringing the light (fire) into the place where people are gathering to worship can be traced back to Old Testament times. In the Tabernacle an oil lamp was lit in order to "keep a flame burning perpetually before the Lord" (Exodus 27:19-20)

In the New Testament, light is also a key image. The Gospel according to St. John describes Our Lord as "the Light". Jesus said: "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12). The presence of light reminds us of Jesus' coming into our world to illuminate our lives.

When our acolyte (from the Greek word $\dot{\alpha}\kappa\dot{\alpha}\lambda o\upsilon\theta o\varsigma$ meaning an attendant) carries a flame into the worship service it is done as a symbol of The Holy Spirit's movement within the community. The two candles on the Lord's Table are reminders of God's Law and His Grace and also that Christ is both human and divine in nature."

When the acolyte extinguishes the candles during the closing hymn, a flame is carried back out of the worship space. This symbolizes the light of Jesus Christ going out into the world where believers are called to serve."
